The family of Lucy Byrd and the Lord's church in this area will greatly miss this wonderful Christian lady. She has touched the hearts of many, many people by being blessed to live 96 years.

She was a Hart County native, a retired school teacher and a member of the South Green Street Church of Christ. She was preceded in death by her parents, Hubbard and Lula Reynolds Smith; her husbands, William Buckles and Andrew Every; two brothers, bro. Paul R. Smith and James Smith; one sister, Ruth Brooks.

She began her teaching career in 1933 in Hart County, and in 1945 she taught in the Cave City High School and became supervisor for the Barren County School System the following year. She served as a Principal and Supervisor in the Nelson Co. Ky school system, and in 1953 she moved to Florida to be a consultant in Elementary Education for the State Department of Education. In 1971, she retired as a Supervisor from the Daytona Beach, Florida Schools after 38 years of service in public education. The greatest thing about Lucy Byrd is that she was a Christian. -WH
