# **Not Strange**

The apostle Peter admonished, "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you" (1 Peter 4:12).

How easy it is to become accustomed to comfort! When all things are going well with us, we are prone to believe that it should always remain so. Anything that disrupts our accustomed comfort is regarded as "strange" or alien to the way things should be.

Believers in Christ in our country have grown accustomed to the blessing of freedom, as guaranteed by our Constitution. We, especially, as Christians, have relished our freedom to practice our Christian faith without fear of government interference, and to share Christian faith and values with those around us. Indeed, the founders of our nation based these freedoms upon scriptural principles. However, at no time in our history have these freedoms been so threatened as they are now. In the last two years attacks on churches have grown from earlier years to over 1000—some against church buildings, others against congregants.

For a people who have taken for granted that this situation would be forever secure, it has become "strange" that we are expected to endorse such cultural changes as the killing of babies in their mothers' wombs, same-sex sexual relations, and even same-sex "marriage," or find ourselves threatened by "hate-crime laws". For a preacher to preach what the Bible teaches (Lev. 18:22; Rom. 1:26-27) against these practices will put him in jeopardy for arrest and civil lawsuits, as has been the case in other nations. It should not surprise us if the Bible itself will be viewed as a vehicle for "hate-speech".

However, we should not consider such to be "strange." Jesus has informed us that the absence of persecution would be strange. He told His disciples, "If we were of the world, the world would love his own: but because ye are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world hateth you" (John 15:19). Paul spoke of the eventual deliverance of believers "from this present evil world" (Gal. 1:4). By "world" is meant the age or dispensation, not the earthly globe. It is of this age that Satan is declared to be "the god of this world (age)" (2 Cor. 4:4), that is, it is he that dominates the present worldorder. In such a system, it is imperative that the Christian don "the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day" (Eph. 6:11), being "strong in the Lord" (v. 10), struggling "against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places" (v. 12). In fact, to some degree we may be confident that "All that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution" (2 Tim. 3:12). We are to be as the faithful of the Old Testament who "confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth" (Heb. 11:13b). Yes, in this world-order, believers are the "strangers," or strange ones. The reason is that "our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ," (Phil. 3:20 NKJV).

May we never become so comfortable in this world that we feel we must conform to its standards, but live in the light of the Gospel of Christ. - Ron Bartenan
